Our Christmas Concert in December '25 of Rossini's 'Petite Messe Solennelle'

On Saturday April 5th, Aylesbury Choral Society performed what could possibly described as one of the most important concerts in our history and/or in the musical life of Aylesbury and the Vale.

One of the composers represented was, arguably, the most famous of the period: Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. ACS performed his much loved and extremely popular Coronation Mass in C major (K.317), written in 1779, probably for a premiere in Salzburg Cathedral at the Easter of that year. This is an exuberant, lively piece frequently performed at royal coronation services in the years after its composition. What is, perhaps, most striking though is the work that the choir performed alongside the Mozart.

Marianna Martines was a well known female composer, pianist and singer in Vienna in the late 18th century and was a contemporary and friend of Mozart. Mozart and she were known to have played piano duets together at musical soirees, some of which were composed specially for Marianna and he to play; and he is said to have greatly admired her own compositions. The fact that Marianna had developed some fame as a composer at a time when women were just not expected to take on such a role is a testament to the ambition and enlightenment of her father, Nicolò Martines (a musician of Spanish descent who served as 'master of ceremonies' to the papal nuncio and who was knighted by the Empress Maria Theresia) and the teacher he engaged for her education, Pietro Metastasio. In music, she was taught singing, piano, and composition; and Joseph Haydn - who was a lodger for a time in the family home in Vienna - gave her some additional piano and theory lessons. Yet, despite all this and Marianna's fame at the time, Marianna is almost unheard of today, though she left behind her a large body of the most beautiful and engaging works and she founded a school for the musical education of women in Vienna at the time.. ACS's concert included a performance of one of her most major works and the largest that whe wrote for soloists, chorus and orchestra: the Quarta Messa (written in 1765). This was, we understand, just the third performance of this work in the UK and will certainly be a first for Aylesbury and the Vale. A significant concert, indeed, accompanied by the Aylesbury Sinfonia and directed by Jeff Stewart with four fantastic soloists: Stephanise Bodsworth, Maggie Cooper, Adam Tunnicliffe and Oleksii Zasiadko.

Saturday 21st June, 2025 An evening of opera choruses and arias with Colin Spinks at the piano and Jeff Stewart with quests as soloists.

It has been a real priviledge having him with us for ten highly successful and developmental years, a real joy for all of us in the choir. However, things change and Jeff has decided to retire from some of his activities to leave more 'room' for others.

The committee spent much of the winter period before and after Christmas, advertising, reviewing applications and interviewing prospective candidates. We received eleven *very* strong applications from extremently gifted and enthusistic musicians from the South of England. After a rigourous interviewing process, including online interviews and in-person auditions with the choir, we are very excited to have appointed Mr Philip Stopford, the well-known composer and choral director, who will join us at ACS in September.
